TRIPS GONE BY.....

**SUN VALLEY, IDAHO
MARCH 3 – 10, 2018**



LSSC Skiers

Eight members of LSSC were a part of a group of about 80 on the OVSC trip to Sun Valley, ID, March 3 - 10, 2018. We had one new club member, Jennifer Tavitian, join us on this trip. Our lodging accommodations were excellent. About 10 days before our arrival, we were upgraded from rooms in the Sun Valley Inn to spacious suites in the Sun Valley Lodge. We were provided with robes and slippers, daily maid service including turn-down service, attentive and helpful bell staff, and free ski storage at the River Run base area. The outdoor heated pool was a welcome treat after skiing. We all agreed that the accommodations, as well as the food and service at all of the OVSC functions, were the best we had ever experienced on a ski trip.



The snow conditions on the mountain were good for a spring trip. Sun Valley received a total of 25 inches of snow the Thursday and Friday before our arrival, so there were no bare or icy patches anywhere. High temps were in the upper 20's early in the week, increasing to around 40 degrees by the end of the week. Our first two days of skiing were a bit overcast, as the storm system had not completely dissipated. The third and fourth days were sunny with blue skies. Day five brought a couple inches of heavy wet snow. Finally, day six dawned with sunny skies again, but clouded up mid-afternoon. We all called it quits early that day as the lower elevation runs turned the consistency of mashed potatoes, flat light reduced visibility, and we wanted to watch the Cats play their opening game in the SEC Tournament (the real reason!).

Issues with United Airlines put a damper on the first couple of days of the trip. We flew from Louisville to Denver, planning to connect to a flight to Hailey. Upon arrival in Denver, we learned that our connecting flight had been rerouted to Twin Falls, ID. Seems that low cloud cover in Hailey precluded us from landing there. We were delayed leaving Denver, as one of the doors on an overhead bin would not latch and maintenance had to be called to duct tape(!) it shut. Once in Twin Falls, we had to wait an hour or so for luggage to be removed from the plane and transferred to motor coaches, which we then boarded for the 1 1/2 hour drive to the Hailey airport. Frustration really set in when we realized that our group's checked luggage had been left behind in Denver. Some of it arrived the next day, but the bulk of it arrived on Monday, two full days after our arrival. Ultimately, we all learned a lesson about the importance of packing defensively. Always pack your carry-on with things you will require the first day or two of any trip.

Opportunity to Promote Our Club

Lexington Ski and Sports Club (LSSC) has offered to operate a rest stop during the Horsey Hundred cycling event hosted by the Bluegrass Cycling Club (BCC). Several members of LSSC are also cyclists and belong to the BCC.

So here are the details:

When: Saturday, May 26, 2018, 7:30 AM to 11:30 AM.

Where: Buffalo Springs Park, Stamping Ground, Scott County

What: The Horsey Hundred is a 3-day cycling event that the BCC has offered for over 30 years. Over 2000 cyclists from 45 states and 10 foreign countries participate. Saturday is the big day when riders can attempt a Century, 100 miles in one day. We will operate a rest area in a picnic shelter at Buffalo Springs Park. All the food and supplies will be delivered to the site. Our job will be to keep the snacks and Gatorade flowing as riders pass through. Dan Geiger is the rest stop captain. **We need 2 more volunteers to operate the rest stop.**

LSSC Benefits: We will have our Club banners up and pass out Club literature. We hope to interest a group of outdoor athletes in joining LSSC for Winter sports.

Your Benefits: This will be a fun summer activity with your LSSC friends. We will meet groups of cyclists working hard to achieve their goals. The BCC provides to all volunteers a BCC Horsey Hundred t-shirt, admission to all Horsey events during the 3 days including lunch at Georgetown College on Saturday. You can ride your bike at Friday and Sunday supported rides which are suitable for most fitness levels. If you sign up before April 13 you will also receive your choice of a BCC cooling towel or insulated 24oz water bottle.
