
September Meeting: TRIP **PRESENTATIONS!**







Everything about Chamonix is impressive. In the shadow of Mont Blanc (4,810m), the highest mountain in the Alps, the deep Chamonix valley has more skiable slopes than seems possible and something for all abilities, though adventurous skiers and boarders have most to gain from a visit including ski runs with a vertical elevation of more than 2,000m and the "Vallée Blanche", the most famous off- piste run in the world. A magnet to skiers, mountaineers and all extreme sports devotees, the thriving town of Chamonix is busy all year round and only one hour (103km) from Geneva airport, making it one of Europe's most popular destinations for weekend and short break skiing.

CHAMONIX/MONT BLANC "Best of the Alps" March 7 - 15, 2014

Chamonix-Mont-Blanc or, more commonly known as **Chamonix,** is a commune in the Rhône-Alpes region in south-eastern France. It was the site of the first Winter Olympics in 1924.


Situated near the massive peaks of the Aiguilles Rouges and most notably the Aiguille du Midi, Chamonix is one of the oldest ski resorts in France and is known as the "gateway to the European Cascades". The north side of the summit of Mont Blanc, and therefore the summit itself, are part of the village of Chamonix. To the south side, the situation is different depending on the country. Italy considers that the border passes through the top. France considers that the boundary runs along the rocky Tournette under the summit cap, placing it entirely in French territory. The south side was in France, assigned to the commune of Saint-Gervais-les-Bains sharing the summit with its neighbor Chamonix . It is this situation "for France", which is found on the French IGN maps. The Chamonix commune is well known and loved by skiers and mountain enthusiasts of all types, and via the cable car lift to the Aiguille du Midi it is possible to access the world famous off-piste ski run of the Vallée Blanche.

appeal is universal. Everyone from backpackers to romance-seeking couples and families will love sitting at a cafe on cours Saleya in Vieux Nice or a bench on the legendary Promenade des Anglais for an epic sunset. Eating options are some of the best you'll find in <u>France</u>, the nightlife is buzzing and the art scene thriving. You could happily spend a week here and still be hungry for more.

Pricing has not been finalized, and will depend on the total number of OVSC participants, the Eurodollar exchange rate – at the time of ticketing, and changes in fuel surcharges. Anticipate a price ranging around \$1,179, but could be more if lower than anticipated OVSC- wide count – or lower if there is a larger group.

Important LSSC Trip Policy Information

1. The trip leader will assign a number to each participant in the order his/her application and initial payment is received. This number establishes the ranking for priority in bedding assignments.

2. A participant will retain that ranking so long as trip payments are made in accordance with or in advance of the trip payment schedule, established by the Executive Vice President. Otherwise, the participant will be moved to the end of the ranking, in the order he/she breached the payment schedule.

3. The trip leader will assign bedding based on the ranking of the participant.

a. The trip leader will attempt to accommodate participant's requests for roommates and condo mates.

b. When there is a conflict in roommate and/or condo mate assignments, the participant with the higher ranking shall be accommodated first.

c. Single individuals will be assigned bedrooms with twin beds, in the order of his/her ranking. If the bedding for the trip does not accommodate a single participant having an individual bed, the lower ranking single participants will be assigned to sleep two to a queen/ king bed or the lowest ranking participant will be assigned to the couch/sofa bed, if any.

4. Trip cost adjustment for unfilled rooming

a. If there is a single, unpaid pillow available on a trip and no participant volunteers to pay a single uplift to have a single room, the cost of the pillow will be prorated among all the participants in order to ensure the viability and success of the trip. Unless he or she elects otherwise, the trip leader will have the room with this extra pillow.

b. If there is more than one unpaid pillow, the Board has the right to cancel the unit with the unpaid pillow even though this may result in the lowest ranking participant(s) being cancelled from the trip. Those participants who are cancelled from a trip under this provision will be refunded his or her payment to the extent available. The club will not bear the cost of such cancellation, consistent with the policy that all trips are self-sustaining.

c. Before participants are cancelled from a trip, the trip leader shall use his or her best efforts to secure alternative accommodations for the participant(s), including, but not limited to, sharing with participants in another OVSC club or staying in a hotel. The participants under this provision will bear the additional cost, if any, of the alternative accommodations.

5. The trip leader will advise the Executive Vice President of unfilled slots and incompletely filled condos or hotel rooms, as reserved for the particular trip, in advance of the date to reduce the reservation and not incur an additional cost to the club.
